Corruption is a significant problem around the world. According to the International Transparency (2011) it is defined as “the abuse of entrusted power of private gain”. It is well known that corruption leads to losses of companies’ productivity, lack of competitiveness of firms, social problems and to lower economic development as consequence. Brazil is facing one of the world’s biggest case of corruption, ending in political and serious economic consequences.

In 2017 Brazilian Business Review Special Session, we will focus on corruption in and around organizations, governments and on the role of people (managers, workers, public employees, etc) in corruption.

Based on such guideline and in accordance to the Brazilian Business Review policies we invite authors to submit papers that explore this theme.

Submissions

Please submit papers through BBR online submission system.

The articles may be submitted in Portuguese or English. If approved, the BBR – Brazilian Business Review will provide their publication in these two languages.

- The articles will be submitted by electronic form available on the periodic website (http://www.bbronline.com.br/_autor/);
- The text editor should be Word 6.0 or above;
- Font text: Times New Roman, size 12;
- 1,5 line spacing;
- Justified alignment;
- Margins: top and left: 3 cm, bottom and right: 2 cm;
- Number of words, including title, summary, text, references and illustrations: between 6000 and 8000 for theoretical and empirical articles;
- Citations should be made in the text, in author-data system, including number of pages (if applicable), according to ABNT NBR 10520. Must not be used expressions as id., Ibid., Op. cit., Loc. cit. and similar;
- Full references of cited works should be presented in alphabetical order at the end of the text, according to ABNT NBR 6023;

- Illustrations such as figures, pictures and tables should be prepared according to ABNT NBR 14724, always in black and white, with subtitles, credits and sources. If there are illustrations imported from other programs such as Excel and Power Point, source file also should be sent;
- Reference and explanatory notes should be avoided. The strictly necessary notes should be sequentially numbered in the text and inserted at the end of the text, before the references.

The article must be submitted in a file containing the text of the article itself, with the characteristics described below. On the first page: a. article title (in Portuguese and English) b. summary, containing between 120 and 160 words; c. three to five keywords; d. abstract (text with the same content as summary, in English) e. key words. The body of the article should follow from the second page onwards;

To ensure anonymity of the evaluation process, the author (s) should not identify himself/herself/themselves at the body of the article;

The deadline for the special issue is March 1st 2017.

Authors should ensure to mention by email (bbronline@bbronline.com.br) that the article is to be considered for the special session.
